The Fox International Fellowship Program is a direct two-way student exchange partnership between Yale University and twenty-one of the world's leading universities in **Russia***, **England, Germany, China, Japan, France, India, Mexico, Brazil, Turkey, Israel, South Africa, Ghana, Singapore, Australia, Canada, Denmark, and Argentina.**

History and Donor

The program was established by Joseph Carrère Fox, Yale'38, in 1989 as a result of his deeply held belief in the "...importance of international education in achieving peace and stability in the world of the 21st century."



The Goal of the Fellowship

To identify and support talented individuals who will be future leaders in their respective fields and contribute to decisions affecting global policies and international relations.

To encourage students, while pursuing academic research in another country, to immerse themselves in the local language and culture and develop lasting friendships with peers.

Program Description

Fox Fellowship supports a year (from 9-12 months) of independent research in the following fields:

- International Relations
- Law
- Global Health
- Business and Finance
- Management
- Contemporary History
- Environmental Policy

Selection Criteria

Fox Fellows are selected based on the following criteria:

- Quality of research proposal
- Strength of academic achievement
- Character and demonstrated leadership potential
- Demonstrated personal commitment to being a "citizen scholar ambassador"
- Relevance of the host university for their project

Eligibility Criteria

- Open to:
 - ✓ Graduate Students
 - ✓ Professional Students
 - ✓ Graduating Seniors
 - ✓ Graduating Masters
- Students in doctoral programs shall normally have finished their coursework.
- Students in master or graduate professional programs shall have administrative approval to interrupt their course work.
- The Fox Fellowship is **NOT** open to post-doctoral applicants.
- Applications from international students proposing projects in their home country are **NOT** eligible.

At this time, graduating Yale College seniors and graduating masters are not eligible for the UK.

Fellowship Provides



- Affiliation with the host University, which will provide:
 - ✓ access to archives and library resources
 - ✓ opportunity to work with faculty and interact with other students and researchers in the field
 - ✓ opportunity to audit courses
- Stipend to cover living expenses
- Airfare
- Health Insurance (unless covered by ISOS)
- Research grant of \$2000

Language Requirement

For Berlin, Istanbul, Mexico City, Moscow*, Paris, São Paulo, Buenos Aires, Shanghai, and Tokyo students must demonstrate sufficient language (at least Intermediate Level) proficiency to complete their research program and to communicate directly with their hosts and peers.

- Career goals
 - Stepping stone for your future career
- Letters of reference
 - Attest to your leadership abilities
 - Academic and non-academic achievements

Application form

- Methodology
- What led you to choose this research project in particular?
- What is new or surprising about your research?
- What impact could your research have on future public policy debate?
- Resources needed at the partner institution
- “citizen scholar” – applying academic knowledge to real world problems.
